Review of SSB 5936

- <u>SSB 5936</u> (Chapter 166, Laws of 2024) directs the Office of the Insurance Commissioner (OIC), in consultation with the Health Care Authority, to convene a work group "to design the parameters of a palliative care benefit and payment model for fully insured health plans."
- The work group must coordinate with the ongoing work at the Health Care
 Authority related to designing a palliative care benefit for the state
 Medicaid program and the Employee and Retiree Benefits program
- The work group must hold its first meeting by the end of July 2024
- The work group must submit a report to the Legislature detailing its work and any recommendations, including any legislation, by November 1, 2025



The work group must <u>consider the following elements</u> of a palliative care benefit:

- Clinical eligibility criteria;
- The services included in a palliative care benefit;
- Appropriate staffing, including staffing models and provider training;
- Evaluation criteria and reporting requirements; and
- Payment models.



The work group shall consist of <u>representatives from these organizations</u>:

- 1. Health Care Authority (HCA) (1 representative)
- 2. Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) (1 representative)
- 3. Department of Health (DOH) (1 representative)
- 4. Health Benefit Exchange (HBE) (1 representative)
- 5. Washington State Hospice & Palliative Care Organization (WSHPCO) (1 representative) plus 4 clinician/provider representatives selected by WSHPCO
- 6. Washington State Hospital Association (WSHA) (1 representative)
- 7. Home Care Association of Washington (HCAW) (1 representative)
- 8. Washington State Nurses Association (WSNA) (1 representative)
- 9. Association of Washington Health Care Plans (AWHP) (1 representative) plus 2 plan representatives (commercial health carrier and Medicaid MCO) selected by AWHP
- 10. Washington Health Alliance (1 representative)



SSB 5936 defines "palliative care" as -

"expert assessment and management of a patient's symptoms, including coordination of care, attending to the physical, functional, psychological, practical, and spiritual consequences of serious illness, and assessment and support of caregiver needs. Palliative care is a person- and family-centered approach to care, providing people living with serious illness relief from the symptoms and stress of an illness, and can be delivered alongside life-prolonging or curative care."



- The Legislature appropriated \$228,000 to OIC to carry out SSB 5936 (budget proviso in Sec. 142(22) of ESSB 5950, Chapter 376, Laws of 2024)
- OIC may contract for actuarial analysis
